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# Michigan's Upper Peninsula.....August 9-14, 2021

**Day One**---Today we start our adventure to Michigan's Upper Peninsula via the Mighty Mac Bridge. Late afternoon we arrive in Michigan's oldest city, Sault Ste. Marie, where we will spend the night at the **Kewadin Casino Hotel**. This evening brings an experience to remember as we explore Michigan's oldest city. Our tour includes The Water Street Historic Block, Soo Locks observation deck and visitor's center as well as the 21-story Tower of History that gives you a 25-mile view. Dinner will follow at a local restaurant. Returning to our hotel take advantage of your casino package and try a little lady luck on your favorite slot machine or gaming table. D

**Day Two**---After a full hot breakfast buffet we head to Paradise, MI and continue north to the oldest active lighthouse on Lake Superior and the **Great Lakes Shipwreck Museum** at Whitefish Point. This national historic site is a tribute to the sailors and ships lost along the coastline, known as Lake Superior's Shipwreck Coast. On the way we will watch a video on the sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald. Heading west to the land of the golden water named Tahquamenon Falls we enter the state park and stop for lunch. The nature enthusiasts will enjoy the solitude as we walk through the old growth forest to see one of the largest waterfalls east of the Mississippi River, the upper **Tahquamenon Falls**. Hidden in the forest, the picturesque view definitely requires a camera! Heading toward Newberry, the official Moose Capital of Michigan, we stop to explore the world of the American Black Bear at **Oswald's Bear Ranch**. Continuing west we arrive in beautiful Munising, nestled along the shoreline of Lake Superior and home of the **Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore**. Check into our hotel and enjoy dinner at local restaurant. B, D

**Day Three** ---After breakfast at the hotel, our "natural wonder" journey today, begins with a stop at the **Munising Falls**. Next, we will enjoy an awe-inspiring natural phenomenon as we board our boat for the **Pictured Rocks Cruise**. This fully narrated boat tour will provide the story of Mother Nature's handiwork, breathtaking views that are up close, wonderful and considered some of the greatest sights in Upper Michigan. We will have lunch in the park. After lunch we will continue to explore the Upper Peninsula. Making our way to winter snow country near the Keweenaw Bay, we visit the **Shrine of Bishop Baraga**. Frederic Baraga left his home in Slovenia in 1830 for the Catholic missions of the Upper Great Lakes. Check into our hotel for two nights. Time to freshen up before dinner. B, L, D

**Day Four** ---We start our day early with a full hot breakfast as the miners did so long ago before going to work in the copper mines. We make a stop at Quincy Hill Scenic Overlook before arriving at the **Quincy Mine** for our complete tour of the facility. We start with a visit to the museum then ride on the cog-rail tram down the hill to the mine entrance, ride the tractor-pulled wagon into the mine, seven levels underground. Outfitted with your hard hat, your guide will explain and provide demonstrations to learn of the rigors of such work of the early prospector rushing to mine deposits of native copper along the Keweenaw Peninsula. With our guide we will travel the **National Scenic Byway, the Copper Country Trail** as we head to Copper Harbor, the most northern point in the Upper Peninsula. Our travels will enable us to make a stop at the Keweenaw "**Record Snowfall Marker**" and viewing the **George Gipp Memorial** along with **historic Fort Wilkins**. Time out for lunch and shopping. We continue to travel on **Brockway Mountain Drive** from Copper Harbor to the top of Brockway Mountain to view Lake Superior and the surrounding countryside from the top! This is the highest above sea-level drive between the Rockies and Alleghenies. Next, we visit in Eagle Harbor and visit the **Eagle Harbor Lighthouse** which was originally built in 1851. Time for a stop at the well-known bakery **The Jampot!** Not your ordinary bakery, as it is operated by the Society of St. John, a monastery affiliated with the Ukrainian Catholic Church. From here you will also be able to view **Jacob's Falls**. With our guide we continue on with a tour of downtown and **Historic District of Calumet**, which, was once at the center of the mining industry of the Upper Peninsula. The village originally settled in 1864 was named for a Native American Chief of the Seneca tribe and was called "Red Jacket". Dinner included this evening. B, L, D

**Day Five**--- A full hot breakfast at the hotel before checking out prepares us for another great day of sightseeing. A visit to the UP would not be complete without a stop at **Da Yoopers Tourist Trap**. Located in Ishpeming, the heart of Yooperland, not only will you leave with something unusual but a chuckle or two as well. Arriving in Marquette, MI the most populated city in the Upper Peninsula and home to Northern Michigan University, your guide will point out the many reasons for the accolades and awards the community has received. After lunch, we see another alluring natural attraction, Michigan's largest freshwater spring, **Kitch-iti-kipi, The Big Spring**. You will learn the legends of Kith-iti-kipi and also take the observation raft ride over the crystal-clear water of the spring, which is two hundred feet across, and 40 feet deep. The underwater features and mysteries are a challenge to the imagination. We continue our tour through the Upper Peninsula with additional scenic shoreline views as we make our way to St. Ignace. Our last evening is at the **Kewadin Casino Hotel**. B, L, D

**Day Six** ---Full hot breakfast included at the hotel prior to checking out. INDIANA.... here we come!!! B
