Known for its picturesque coastal towns, specialty shops, fish boils, cherry orchards and scenic beauty, **Door County**, Wisconsin is often referred to as the “Cape Cod of the Midwest.” With the waters of Green Bay on one side and Lake Michigan on the other, the Door Peninsula offers spectacular waterfront views, with more than 300 miles of shoreline featuring towering limestone bluffs, rugged rock formations and pristine beaches.

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Day One: Off we go to Green Bay, the smallest city to host a National Football League team. The Green Bay Packers are the only NFL team to be owned by its fans! Located at the southern end of Green Bay, an arm of Lake Michigan, the city is the state's oldest settlement. After arriving to our hotel, take some time to unwind and relax before dinner. D

Day Two: This morning we will enjoy a hearty breakfast before our Wisconsin adventure begins! We'll start our day with a guided tour of the famed **Lambeau Field**. This NFL field is the crown jewel of the National Foot League! It underwent a dramatic facelift in 2003, and is now a year-round tourist destination where people come to learn a bit of history, go into the bowl of Lambeau Field, take photos and see a treasure trove of artifacts in the Hall of Fame Museum. After our tour, we will head towards **Door County**, the easternmost county in the state. It is named after the strait between the Door Peninsula and Washington Island. The dangerous passage, known as Death's Door, contains shipwrecks and was known to Native Americans and early French explorers. In the 1800's Moravians founded Ephraim as a religious community and a large- scale immigration of Belgians populated a small region in the southern portion of the county. They built small roadside votive chapels, some still in use today. Sturgeon Bay was named for the long, fish-shaped bay it borders. It was settled in 1850 when the first house was built along the waterfront. The new passage quickly attracted thousands of ships and it became a center of maritime traffic and shipbuilding. On our way to Brussels, we will stop at **The Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help**. This is a sacred place where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in October 1859 to a Belgian immigrant woman, Adel Brise. There is a café and visitor center here, church, and an underground chapel at the site of the apparition. Following lunch, a local Belgian guide will take us around and share the history of the Belgians in this area of Wisconsin. We will learn more about the Shrine we visited on our way to lunch and stop at a few roadside chapels that were built in the 1800s. After saying good-bye to our step on guide, we are off to our home for the next 3 nights, Stone Harbor Resort. This resort overlooks the waters of Sturgeon Bay. In the background of the resort, we can get a view of the famous Sturgeon Bay Bridge. Dinner this evening will be at the resort. B, L, D

Day Three: Rise and shine early this morning as after an early breakfast we are off with our step-on guide to Washington Island. As we head north enjoy the beauty of the drive through quaint villages and the beautiful views of rural landscapes. Our motorcoach will drive directly onto the **Washington Island Ferry Line** for a 5-mile ride across the famous crossing known as "Death's Door." Our stops on the island will include **Mann's Mercantile**, the island's own version of a big city Walmart. Souvenirs of all kinds plus cream and butter fudge can be found here! Schoolhouse Beach will be our next stop. A geological marvel, this beach is like a dream. Instead of a sand beach, you'll find a layer of limestone that have been here for hundreds of thousands of years. The rocks under the water have been smoothed out by centuries of wave action as well as glaciers that moved through the area and deposited them here millions of years ago. The rocks are so unique that a law was passed making it illegal to remove rocks from the beach. Only 5 beaches like this exist in the world. Protected in its little cove, this beach and its deep blue waters really feels like a secret discovery. We will make a stop at the **Washington Island Farm Museum**. Farm buildings from various locations on the island were re-assembled here along with old-time farm tools and implements. There is special emphasis on the period from 1870-1940. A must see when on the island is the **Stavkirke – Stave Church**. Seemingly dropped in place right from medieval Norway, the traditional wooden stave church belonging to Wisconsin's Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church was built to honor the area's Scandinavian heritage. Before leaving the island, we will enjoy an included lunch at Nelson's Hall Bitters Pub, the oldest continuously-operating tavern in Wisconsin. Once we are back over on the mainland, we will head to Ephraim and the **Island Lavender Shop**. Here, they harvest their own lavender buds and artfully distill the essential lavender oil to make over 160 products for their customers. After returning to Stone Harbor Resort, enjoy your evening and dinner on your own. There are quite a few restaurants within a half mile of the resort. B, L

Day Four: We depart after breakfast this morning with our step on guide and have a photo stop at the **Old Rugged Cross**. In 1913, The Old Rugged Cross was first sung at the Friends Church in Sturgeon Bay as a duet by two traveling preachers. Next, we head to the **Door Peninsula Winery**, which is the largest winery (and distillery) in the state of Wisconsin. Get your cameras ready once again for the beautiful views at **Scenic Cave Point**. This place is geologically gorgeous and photographers can't get enough of it. The limestone cliffs, coves, caves amidst the backdrop of turquoise waters and beautiful Lake Michigan makes this park a favorite. We will have time to spend at **Bjorklunden Chapel (Boynton Chapel)**, a small wooden chapel built in a late 12th-century Norwegian stave church style. The chapel contains 41 hand-painted frescoes and numerous exceptionally fine carved-wood furnishings. Lunch today is at Al Johnson's Swedish Restaurant & Butik for lunch, shopping and viewing their goats on the roof! The goats graze the sod roof atop this casual log-cabin eatery serving traditional Swedish food. At the **Seaquist Orchards Farm Market** we will enjoy a tour and learn about six generations of the Seaquist family. Here we will have a tour guide step on our bus and will drive with us throughout several acres of cherries, apples, apricots, and sweet cherries offering us an opportunity to see a "working farm" and provide a fun, informative talk. Whether a maritime buff, architecture aficionado, or just on the hunt for vacation phot-ops, there are 11 lighthouses throughout Door County. Our next stop will **Peninsula State Park** to see and tour the **Eagle Bluff Lighthouse**. Perched on a bluff, 76 feet above Green Bay's glistening waters, this lighthouse brought solace to many sailors. Restored to its past glory, Eagle Bluff Lighthouse is a tribute to the keepers who kept the lamp burning on many a dark and stormy night. The day will end with an all-encompassing dining experience, **Door County's renowned fish boil**. This tradition began as a way to feed large groups of hungry fisherman and lumberjacks, the fish boil has remained a succulent way to gather in the community. Each fish boil fire offers the crowd of hungry onlookers and unforgettable experience followed by an incomparable meal. At Pelletier's of Fish Creek, once the fish oils float to the surface of the boiling water, the "master boiler" throws fuel into the fire, causing a climatic flaming boil-over of the fish oils! Then, dinner is served! Back to hotel. B, L, D

Day Five: This morning we will enjoy one last hearty breakfast before heading home with wonderful memories of Door County, Wisconsin! B
