Day One...All Aboard!!!! Travel to our overnight location, Beckley, WV. Dinner included. D

Day Two...Breakfast included at hotel. First stop today is Charlottesville, VA. Lunch is included at the historical **Michie Tavern**. Built in 1784 and a superb example of the 1920's preservation movement, famed Michie Tavern offers an exciting historical experience and wonderful food in a rustic atmosphere. Visit **Monticello, Home of Thomas Jefferson**. Monticello was designed and redesigned, and built and rebuilt for more than 40 years. Jefferson described the house as his "essay in architecture". Today, it is recognized as an international treasure. Continue to Williamsburg. Dinner included. B, D

Day Three...After breakfast, enjoy a guided tour of **Jamestown Settlement**. At Jamestown Settlement, learn about events and social and economic conditions that led to the English colonization of America and the formation of the Virginia Company that sponsored Jamestown with a goal of earning its investors a profit. Learn about the land and lifestyle of Algonquian-speaking tribes in coastal Virginia under the powerful leader Powhatan and about the culture of the first documented Africans in Virginia. Outdoor living history areas bring the 17<sup>th</sup> century to life—the re-created Powhatan Indian village, re-created James Fort, Riverfront Discovery Area, and full-size replicas of the three ships, Susan Constant, Discovery and Godspeed, that transported the original Jamestown colonists to Virginia in 1607. Lunch on own at Jamestown Café. After lunch, observe the **Glass Blowing Exhibit**. No visit to Historic Jamestown is complete without a visit to the Glasshouse. America's first English industrial manufacture began here with a "trial of glass". Jamestown was established by the Virginia Company of London in May 1607. One of the first English attempts at industrialization and manufacturing in America was glassblowing. The Company hoped glass production might provide the profit that it was looking for. The New World abounded with raw materials—wood for fuel and ash, and sand (silica) for the glass. All that was needed were artisans and various laborers to produce the glass. Next, we will visit **Berkeley Plantation**. This plantation is one of Virginia's most historic plantations. On December 4, 1619, early settlers from England came ashore at Berkeley Plantation and observed the first official Thanksgiving in America. See the birthplace of Benjamin Harrison, signer of the Declaration of Independence, and President William Henry Harrison, "Old Tippecanoe". "Taps" was composed at Berkeley when General McClellan headquartered 140,000 Union troops in 1862. Dinner included this evening. B, D

Day Four...Enjoy breakfast at hotel. The day starts with a guided tour of **Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area** including the Governor's Palace. From 1699 to 1780, Williamsburg was the political, social and cultural capital of Britain's largest, wealthiest and most populous colony. Colonial Williamsburg encompasses more than 500 buildings and 90 acres of magnificent gardens. In the shops, taverns, government buildings, home and streets, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Patrick Henry, George Mason and other Virginia Patriots debated the ideas – liberty, independence, and personal freedoms – that led to the founding of American democracy. Lunch on own at Merchants Square. A guided tour of the **American Revolution Museum of Yorktown** is included in the afternoon. Gain an appreciation of our nation's evolution from colonial status to nationhood. An outdoor re-created Continental Army encampment and historical interpreters depict the daily life of a soldier and a re-created 1780's farm provide a look at how Americans lived in the early years of our nation. Sit back and relax as we take a riding tour of the **Yorktown Battlefields**. Dinner included. B, D

Day 5...After breakfast, we will travel to **Historic St. John's Church** in Richmond, VA. Enjoy a rare re-enactment of Patrick Henry's famous speech. As tensions grew between the colonies and Great Britain in the 1770's, Virginia held a series of meetings to organize its protests against the mother country. In March of 1775, the Second Virginia Convention was held here at what was then called Henrico Parish Church. Patrick Henry, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Peyton Randolph and other prominent Virginians were delegates to the convention. Here, Patrick Henry embodied the spirit of the Revolution on March 23, 1775, with his words, "Give me liberty...or give me death!" Time to say "good-bye" to Virginia. Overnight lodging in West Virginia. Dinner included. B, D
